The **ENETS Translational Research Fellowship** is designed to:

- Provide training in translational research in European centers with international reputation in the field of gastroenteropancreatic neuroendocrine tumors (GEP-NETs).
- Improve career development through collaboration with this center.
- Provide the necessary support to develop specific high-quality translational research projects in GEP-NETs.

Amount Granted

- The total grant amount for a one-year ENETS Translational Research Fellowship is Euro 20,000.
- A second year prolongation may be requested.
- Please note that research activities should primarily involve GEP-NET-related research.

Eligibility Criteria

Candidates must:

- Be a biologist, physiologist, endocrinologist (in training), gastroenterologist (in training), geneticist (in training), internist (in training), oncologist (in training), nuclear medicine physician (in training), pathologist (in training), radiologist (in training), or surgeon (in training), have a minimum of two years clinical experience in their field and show particular interest in the GEP-NET field
- Be no older than 40 years of age
- Be a current ENETS Member (or must apply for membership)
- Have a reasonable level of spoken and written English or of the community language of the host institute
- In addition, the candidate's supervisors at both the host and home institute should be preferably an ENETS member.

Application requirements

Application must include:

- Curriculum vitae complete with clear digital photograph
- Detailed description of the planned research program
- Brief statement of candidate's goals and how he/she proposes to utilize the acquired techniques, or knowledge in the home institute/country
- Name of selected host institute, accompanied by a letter of acceptance from the person responsible for the research project at the host facility. Generally the host institute cannot accommodate two ENETS fellows at the same time. Applicants should discuss appropriate timing with possible supervisors
- Letter of recommendation from the candidate's department head.

Selected candidates for an **ENETS Translational Research Fellowship** should deliver the results of their supported research activities in the form of a written report within three months after the end of their fellowship, as well as have to present the results of their studies at the annual ENETS meeting.

Number of fellowships

- ENETS offers **1 ENETS Translational Research Fellowships** per year to a young researcher at a notable European GEP-NET laboratory or clinical facility with ongoing organized translational research activities. The winner of the 2010 award will be announced at the ENETS Annual Conference in Berlin.
